

1. Put double sided tape on the back of the inner piece of the hoop



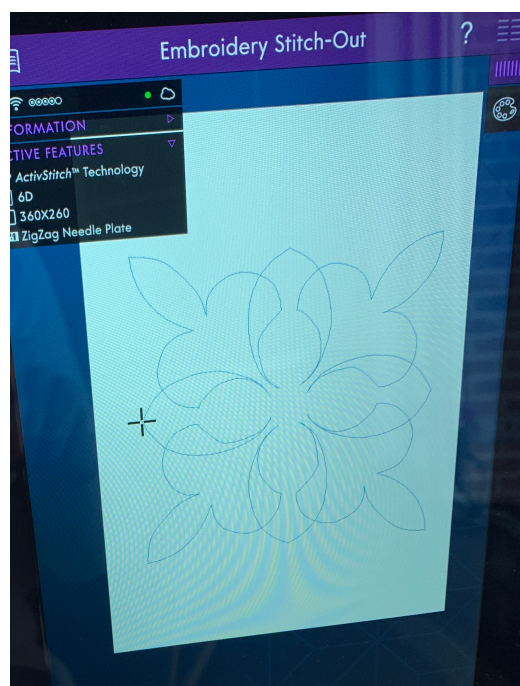
2. Centre the inner part of the hoop over your fabric making sure the vertical and horizontal are aligned (I don't have a design I'm working with here, I'm just putting the hoop on top of a quilt sandwich to show you). Once you have the inner hoop piece positioned, the tape will hold it in position while you add the outer piece beneath the sandwich.



3. Slip the outer part of the hoop beneath the quilt sandwich, loosen the screw enough to allow you to push the inner part into the outer part, push the lever closed - it will be/should be tight. You don't need to bother with clips to hold the fitted hoop in place, but be careful when picking up your hooped quilt to hold the fabric and not the hoop itself.



4. Bring up your embroidery design on the screen, make sure you have selected the hoop you are going to use

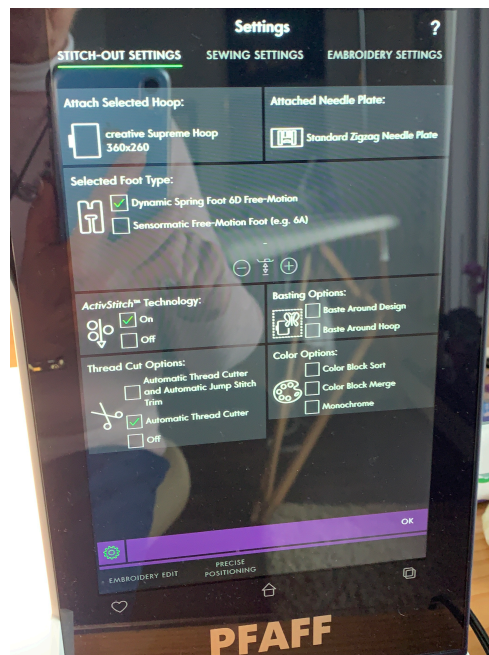


5. Insert the arm of the hoop into the embroidery unit

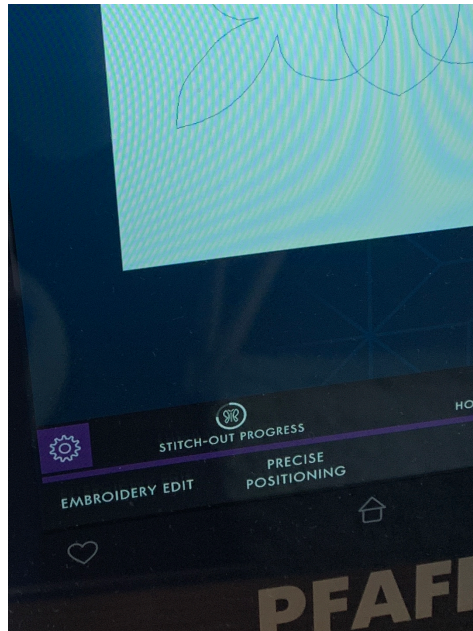


6. Go to Embroidery Stitch-out

The Settings screen will show, and you make sure you have the right hoop, etc. click OK.



7. In the Embroidery Stitch-Out screen, select Precise Positioning/Design Positioning so you can precisely align the design.



8. Make sure the four corners of the design fall within the quilt block, if not, use the precise positioning to align the design precisely within your quilt block.
